



Alli the Onion Amigurumi Free Crochet Pattern

Materials

Liberty Craft Colors 'Eat your Veggies' – Fair Isle Yarn, colors #258 Honey and

#310 Clover

D/3 3.25 mm Crochet hook

Stitch marker

Scissors

Two 9 mm black plastic safety eyes

Polyester fiberfill

Black crochet thread or black embroidery thread

Pink felt or pink blush

Tapestry needle

Hot glue gun and glue stick.



Abbreviations

- st = stitch
- sc = single crochet
- inc = increase (crochet 2 sc in same stitch)
- dec = decrease (crochet 2 sc together)
- sl st = slip stitch
- ch = chain
- BLO = back loop only
- MR = magic ring
- FO = finish off
- * * = repeat from * to * as many times as indicated

Notes

IMPORTANT: Work in continuous spiral rounds. Unless otherwise specified, do not join at the end of each round.



Body

From bottom to top. With color Honey create a MR.

1. 6 sc into MR = 6
 2. BLO – only for this round- *inc* repeat 6 times = 12
 3. *1 sc, inc* repeat 6 times = 18
 4. *2 sc, inc* repeat 6 times = 24
 5. *3 sc, inc* repeat 6 times = 30
 6. to 11. sc into each st = 30
 12. *3 sc, dec* repeat 6 times = 24.
- Insert and secure safety eyes between Rounds 8 and 9.
13. *2 sc, dec* repeat 6 times = 18.
- Start stuffing the body as you go.
14. sc into each st = 18
 15. *1 sc, dec* repeat 6 times 12
 16. sc into each st = 12
 17. *dec* repeat 6 times = 6
 18. sc into each st. FO. Leave a tail.

If you wish you can add small strands of yarn onto the bottom of the onion to imitate the roots. I pulled these strands through the front loops of Round 2 and secured them with a knot.

Sprouts (Make 3)

With color Clover, crochet three I-cords of different lengths, as long or as short as you wish. June Gilbank from Planet June has a [great video tutorial](#) on how to crochet an I-cord.

Once you've reached the desired length, yarn over and draw the yarn through all 3 loops on your hook (like a decrease). Finish off and weave in ends. Place sprouts inside of the body. Then use the tail from the body to sew both sprouts and onion together.

Finishing touches

To create the cheeks, cut two small circles of pink felt and carefully glue them under the eyes of the onion. If you don't have felt, you can apply a little bit of blush with a cotton swab.

With a tapestry needle and black crochet thread or black embroidery thread, embroider a smile.

To create the arms, with Honey yarn, pull up a loop through a stitch on the side of the body and chain 6 or more, depending how long you want the arms to be. Finish off and fray end.

And you are done!
